



Dog Daycare, Lodging, Grooming, & Training

Welcome to Camp Canine! Camp Canine is a fun adventure for your dog and their safety is our first priority. This is a bit of information about how our facility operates and cares for your furry family member.

General

Collars and Leashes: Please keep your dog on a leash while entering or leaving our facility. Do not allow your dog to approach other dogs or people. All dogs on the premises may not be dog friendly and behaviors can be influenced by being on leash and with their owners. All collars and leashes are removed once the dog is secure in our premises.

Daycare

Doggie Daycare can be a great experience for active and social dogs. They will get lots of exercise, make new friends, and go home very sleepy. Please read the following information to determine if our environment is right for your dog. Keep in mind that when you signed your Pet Profile, you acknowledged that you are responsible for any expenses your dog incurs while at Camp Canine.

Schedule: Our business hours are 7:00am - 6:30pm Mon – Fri. We do allow early drop off (to our existing customers only) any time after 6:00am. Dogs play all day up until 5:00pm and then they are placed in our nap room for pick up, which is anytime up until 6:30 pm. Any dogs not picked up will be boarded overnight and will incur an additional charge.

Feeding: If your dog has eaten within an hour of being dropped off he/she may have some digestive issues due to excitement while at play.

Toys in Our Facility: We know that your dog may love to play with balls and toys. However, because safety is our number one priority, we do not allow toys in the daycare areas. It is possible for dogs to become possessive of a toy and this can be dangerous for dogs around them. They can also become choking hazards for larger dogs.

Injuries: Our counselors monitor the play continuously to ensure the dogs safety. That being said, injuries can still happen. Dogs play with their mouths and paws. Punctures, scrapes and scratches can happen. This happens more often in dogs with thinner, shorter coats. Dogs can sometimes snap at each other resulting in a scuffle. Scuffles are broken up quickly but may still result in some minor injury. Aggressive dogs are not allowed back in our facility for the safety of dogs and counselors alike. Once again, this is a risk of socializing dogs and you are responsible for any vet bill incurred.

Playgroups: We do not regularly separate by size or play style, but we do have the capability to break our play yards into 3-6 groups at our discretion. We have both indoor and outdoor areas for the dogs to play. Our outside yards are K9 Grass and two of them are covered to allow for the dogs to still play outside if raining. During the warmer weather we put out pools for the dogs to play in between 10am & 1pm. Unless otherwise told, we do give each dog a spritz of cologne to ensure they go home fresh smelling.

Illness: Daycare is a bit like child daycare. All dogs are required to be vaccinated. However, the Bordetella and Canine Influenza vaccines DO NOT prevent the dogs from catching these illnesses. A healthy looking dog may come to Camp that has yet to show any symptoms, and by the time the symptoms appear, he/she has spread the illness to many other dogs that they were playing with. We disinfect the play area on a daily basis and also have an air purification system installed. We also do not take in dogs that show signs of communicable illness; however, outbreaks can happen occasionally. This is a risk of socializing your dog in any environment. We will try to let you know if an outbreak has occurred and if your dog is sick you may choose to take him/her to the vet. It is imperative that you inform us if your dog develops any type of illness. **(Remember that we do not assume responsibility for veterinary expenses for dogs that pick up an illness while in our care.)** These illnesses may include Kennel Cough, Giardia, Canine Papilloma (Puppy Warts), and Conjunctivitis.

Camp Counselors

Our Certified Counselors are trained on how to interact with dogs in a social group setting as well as in Dog First Aid & CPR.

1. While running around may seem like a good idea to us it creates an unstable and unsafe environment. Dogs that get over stimulated can cause an unbalanced energy level within the group which can cause a scuffle. Another dog could cause a tear in the skin if trying to play with a dog that is sprinting by.
2. Our Counselors love our dogs but showing this through hugs and kisses in a day care setting can cause “jealousy” and this can be dangerous for the dogs and our Counselors. Our Counselors are trained to give love and affection in a calm and safe manner.

We retain the right to remove a dog from the daycare program at any time.

Additional Daycare Services: If you feel your dog needs extra physical or mental stimulation, we also offer treadmill sessions. We do not charge for the training that is required to have your dog run on the treadmill. You will just need to pay for the sessions.

Grooming Services: The items listed below can be scheduled by making an appointment or they can be combined with a day of daycare.

- Full Service Grooming (cut or trim fur) and includes nail trim and cleaning and/or plucking of the ear
- Deshedding treatment
- Bath includes nail trim and cleaning of the outer ear area
- Nail trim only (cut or dremmel)
- Anal glands
- Brushing teeth
- Specialty shampoos (Oatmeal for dry skin or Tea Tree Oil for hot spots)
- Brush or blow outs
